Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Next Wednesday the 5 March, we will be celebrating Ash Wednesday. This marks the beginning of the season of Lent and is a very important day in our Liturgical Calendar. The children in Years Two to Six will celebrate Mass with Father Errol at 9.30am and afterwards the Pre-Primary and Year One children will celebrate a Liturgy also with Father Errol. Thank you to Mrs Coyle and Mrs Brown for organising these special events.

On Tuesday 4 March and Wednesday 5 March, it is Photo Day at school. The children in Years One to Six need to be in their best summer formal uniform on their photo day. Family photos cannot be ordered online, and you will need to collect a family photo envelope from the office by the 16 February. Family Photos will be taken between 8.30am-9.00am (Tuesday) and 8.00am and 9.00am (Wednesday) at the School Chapel. On both days, parents will need to supervise their children before school, at the Chapel, as there will not be a teacher on duty at this time. You will be notified as to which day your photo is scheduled.

The children in Years Three and Five are working hard on their Practice Tests for NAPLAN. This year NAPLAN will commence in Week Seven of Term One. It is hoped that this earlier testing period, which was trialled last year, will enable schools to have data available in a timely manner, to drive and inform their teaching programs.

Ash Wednesday


Next Wednesday is Ash Wednesday. Many Christians receive a cross of ashes on their foreheads at the special Mass. During the season of Lent, to help us become better we are encouraged to do three things: give to the poor; pray to God, and fast. People did these things in the time of Jesus but, as we hear today, he warns them not to make a show of it.




